Recently I've come to a conclusion about life that holds some significant spiritual implications. Simply stated, understanding "life" has a lot to do with perspective.

This statement is not intended to take anything away from the impact of the events or circumstances of life. However, it is meant to draw our attention to the fact that the way we view life and the filters we use to perceive it, play a significant role in how we process it.

The entire concept of perspective has even greater significance for the follower of Christ. For the believer, developing and applying a godly perspective is one of the keys to coping with the ups and downs and ins and outs of our everyday existence. For the believer, life must be about reflecting a biblical perspective in everything we do. Paul clearly articulates this in 1 Corinthians 10:31, "*So, whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God.*" This simple verse has profound implications in forging a godly "perspective of our perspective."

I invite you to join with me today as we mutually explore the concept of what it means to develop a godly perspective in the good times, the bad times, and all the times in between.
